

**Harold Walkup Supply List**  
**Focus on Value workshop at OSA, December 4-6, 2021**

Watercolors:

I use mostly Winsor Newton, Daniel Smith and Steven Quiller

Tube Colors

1. Cadmium Yellow Light
2. Viridian
3. Thalo Blue (Winsor Blue)
4. Ultramarine Violet
5. Permanent Rose
6. Cadmium Red Orange (Pyrrole Orange)
7. Titanium White

There are several secondary colors I use, but for the most part you can mix all colors from these 6 colors + White.

However, here are the secondary colors I use:

1. Permanent Green Light
2. Cobalt Turquoise
3. Ultramarine Blue (French Ultramarine Blue)
4. Magenta
5. Cad Red Medium
6. Cad Orange
7. Burnt Sienna (Daniel Smith similar: Quinacridone Burnt Orange)

In Addition we will be using 4 Derwent Inktense Pencils: Ink Black, Poppy Red, Sea Blue, Sun Yellow—If you are unable to find these exact colors, any dark and any red, yellow or blue will work just fine.

Paper:

Arches 140# Rough, usually 18" X 24", but various sizes depending on the subject. I usually stretch my paper on Gator Board. Any good quality watercolor paper will work. I do stay away from the Strathmore brands as they are usually student grade.

Brushes:

I have recently discovered Escoda synthetic brushes made in Spain. These are some of the best brushes I have used. Be sure to get the ones for watercolor and not oil. I use both flat and round

brushes and a rigger or two of different sizes. However, any good brush will work, though. (Available through Cheap Joes, Blick, etc.)

A few optional brushes: Cheap Joe's Golden Fleece Bold Wash brush or their White Synthetic 3" brush or Miller's Pseudo Sable Mottler. These are the least expensive brushes that I have been able to find from about \$25 to \$35 each. With a search you can find others in a price range from \$35 - \$95.

#### Miscellaneous:

1. Water container—I use 2 Ace Hardware small paint buckets (2 quart?)
2. Tissues
3. Sketch Book
4. 2B, 4B and 6B pencils
5. White eraser
6. Watercolor Palette (There are 100s to choose from) If you want suggestions, just email me: [haroldwalkup@gmail.com](mailto:haroldwalkup@gmail.com)
7. A few paper towels

You can use any other items you are comfortable with and what you may commonly use. I can work with anything you might have, but the higher the quality the better.
