

# Supply list For Acrylic Painting Class

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Paints: For beginners: Acrylics sets are great. Winsor Newton has a good set. This set of six 60 ml tubes contains one each of Cadmium Yellow Medium, Cadmium Red Hue, Winsor Blue, Phthalo Green, Burnt Umber, and Titanium White.

I like Golden, Blick or Holbein brands & other colors recommended but optional (not open or student brand): alizarin crimson, cadmium orange, cobalt violet, ultramarine blue, burnt sienna, yellow ochre, Naples yellow, pink (or flesh), sap green, emerald green, Prussian blue, Payne's grey, cerulean blue, titan buff and Mars black.

Any brand of Gesso (small bottle)

Brushes: Small, medium and large sizes of both sable (soft) and bristle (stiff) brushes, natural or synthetic, filbert, flat & round. Use your own judgement of what you might like.

For cleaning brushes: a small jar filled with Murphys Oil Soap, "Original Formula".  
(grocery & hardware stores)

Painting surfaces: 2 to 3 sheets of 140 lb. or 300 lb. cold press watercolor paper (22" x 30") to start with

optional surfaces: canvas or watercolor pads 9" x 12", canvas boards and wood cradles, all around 9" x 12"

Palettes: paper plates, plastic plates & "Stay-Wet" palettes (optional) - either large or small

Water container

VIVA paper towels

Other Optional things I like : pencils, eraser, stick of chalk, charcoal, masking tape, scissors, toothbrush, scrapers, palette knife, Miniwax Polycrylic Water Based varnish, Polymer varnish, rubbing alcohol, spray bottle-small & large, old credit cards.

Highly recommended: some kind of container or box to carry your supplies in (I use a box that has a long handle and wheels that I got at Michaels)
